

Are you looking to sharpen your leadership skills?

Mentor a student once a week in a North Kingstown school and get a chance to lead by example, be a role model and earn the trust of another – all skills that can be used in the workplace. Students are referred to the mentoring program by teachers who are looking to help particular students thrive in school. Your mentee will not have significant behavior issues or learning disabilities, but never-the-less, the students referred often have behavior that is challenging in the class situation or a lack of attention to school work. Mentoring a student will sharpen and refine your leadership qualities, as tactics used to motivate a student, many times, can also be used with adults. Not only will you be honing your leadership skills, but by volunteering to be a mentor you will round out your resume with community service. The North Kingstown Mentoring Program is looking for positive, caring adults to spend quality time with a young person to make a difference in his or her life. We ask that the mentor commit to the student for one hour, once per week for at least one school year. All mentors will be interviewed, have references checked, and undergo a national FBI background check. Training for the mentor position is given.
